

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STOPPIT-3 TEAM NEWS

Yes, our very own **Denise Cranley**, took part in the 2023 Irish Life Dublin Marathon and completed the course, in **just over 5 hours**, despite the wet and rainy conditions!

Over 22,500 people entered the 2023 marathon, which is in its 42nd year. It is Ireland's largest marathon event, and the fourth largest in Europe. A new course record was set by the winner, Kemal Husen, with a time of two hours, six minutes and 52 seconds.

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PARTICIPANT FEEDBACK!

This month we spoke to Rachel* about her experience participating in STOPPIT-3 and STOPPIT-M!

Hi Rachel, thank you for speaking to us today! First off, I wondered if you could explain why you chose to take part in STOPPIT-3 and STOPPIT-M?

We took part as it felt very low risk while hopefully supporting the development of medical research and knowledge that can make a difference for future families.

How did you find the experience of participating?

We were given many opportunities to ask questions and to opt out of the research participation at any moment. There was a bit of extra time added onto appointments to get information, provide consent, and I had to come in the day before my induction for the first injection. However ultimately, this actually revealed that our 'Twin I' had changed position and this further observation gave us the information to make a new plan for our



birth, which changed from being an induction to a caesarean surgery. The caesarean was also booked in more promptly than would otherwise perhaps have been possible, and Rosie from the research team led the surgery which provided us with some continuity of care while we met a lot of different staff members in hospital. The actual injections were in themselves very simple and I cannot even remember them, it just felt like it slotted into the wider hospital experience and care. However I do remember samples being taken from the babies, in particular their hair being cut although they had so little – but it was done with such care and ultimately it was not noticable and did the babies absolutely no harm of course. We met a few research students who shared in the excitement of the birth of our twins, but there was always the constant of Rosie and Indira who we built a relationship with during our participation and when they came to see the twins after their birth.



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PARTICIPANT FEEDBACK CONTINUED

Finally, why would you recommend someone else take part?

Participation was very simple despite there being quite a bit of consent and information required. It is possible to opt out at any moment. It feels important to contribute to medical research when you can – since we all benefit from it. We built somewhat of a relationship with the research staff as they were there before, during and after the birth and they are the only hospital staff we are able to continue having some contact with since the birth of our twins.
